



CABINETRY CARE GUIDE



Cleaning

- Wipe cabinets with a soft, cloth dampened slightly with water. Wipe dry immediately with another soft, clean cloth.
- Use the mildest solution of dish-washing soap to clean your cabinets. Stronger products may harm the cabinet finish.
- Excess moisture is one of your cabinets' worst enemies. Promptly wipe off water and liquid spills using a clean, soft cloth.

Spatters and spills

- Remove oil, grease, or general soil by using a clean cloth dampened with a fresh solution of mild dish-washing soap and water. Rinse with a clean cloth dampened with clean water, then dry thoroughly.

Do not use cleaning products with:

- Harsh chemicals
- Abrasives
- Solvents or petroleum
- Ammonia
- Bleach
- Silicone

Waxing and polishing

- Waxing and polishing are not required or recommended. If you wish to polish your cabinets, you may occasionally use a high-quality polish that is specially formulated for fine furniture, Guardsmen products.
- Do not use wax or polish that contains silicone, as this will create discoloration and a hazy or streaky appearance that can only be removed with extreme measures.
